



TIGER CUBS WOLF CUB SCOUTS EARN YOUR SCOUTING RELIGIOUS EMBLEM AND GROW IN YOUR KNOWLEDGE OF THE LORD

This program is designed for Tiger and Wolf Cubs of the Roman Catholic faith and their parents and families (before beginning the **3rd Grade**.) This program is designed to help the Tiger or Wolf develop a personal relationship with Jesus. With the parents' active participation, the Tiger or Wolf will see Jesus as a real person and his friend. There is an activity workbook to be used in conjunction with this program. It is available from one of the Scout Shops in our Council or online.



- Discuss your intentions to work on this emblem with your parents. You must earn the Light of Christ Emblem **before** completing the 2nd grade.
- ◆ Obtain the Light of Christ Activity book from the Scout Shop or online at: https://www.nccs-bsa.org/store/product/light-of-christ-activity-book/
- ♦ The book is designed for the Cub and their parent or guardian to work on together.
- Diocesan and BSA Youth Protection policies must be followed.



- ♦ When complete have your Cub Master sign the application form on the last page of your Activity Book, certifying that you have been a registered Tiger or Cub for at least 3 months.
- Meet with your parish priest (or designee), show them your completed Activity Book, and have him sign the application form, indicating that you have completed the requirements.
- ◆ Send your application only and \$22.00 fee by December 31st to:

- ♦ Although the book could be completed in four to six hours, the goal of earning a religious emblem is to help the Cub develop a personal relationship with Jesus, so it is suggested that steps be spread over several weeks.
